### ↵ INDEX COAT OF ARMS LOCATED in Sant'Andrew's Propositura

The coat of arms **BARTOLI [1]** is located at first floor on the wall inside the **cloister of the Sant'Andrew's Propositura** in Empoli.

This specimen, made of white marble, was made in memory of **Cosimo di Matteo Bartoli**. He was a Monsignor of **Sant'Andrew's church** from 1598-1625, and he was provided with a benefit in this rectory by Cardinal Alessandro Medici, Archbishop of Florence, appointed with a document called "**Bolla cardinalizia**" and issued on June 29, 1598.
